- 3. If GSO runs short of funds some year, wouldn't it be okay to let the government subsidize AA groups in hospitals and prisons?

- 5.Is a group treasurer's report unimportant AA business? How does the treasurer feel about it?
- 6. How important in my re-

covery is the feeling of selfrespect, rather than the feeling of being always under obligation for charity received?
